Regular Meeting Minutes May 19, 2026

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Commissioner Davis made a motion to approve the minutes of the April 21, 2026 meeting. Commissioner McDowell seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

1. Chief's Report

a) Significant Monthly Events

- Recruit Graduation- May 21 (Northshore Church)
- 2025 Audit(s)- Chief Kaufmann reported that there were no findings or recommendations.
- 2027 Budget- Chief Kaufmann stated that we will request a draft of the tax roll and begin the budget process June 1. He further stated that we intend to vote on the millage by July 1.

There was discussion on moving the June meeting due to the upcoming election, and it was determined the meeting would be held on June 23. Chief Kaufmann stated that his intent is to keep the millage where it currently is at 32.4 mills.

Commissioner Davis made a motion to adopt Resolution 2026-021, Relating to the Approval to Levy the 2026 Parcel Fee on the Tax Roll for District No. 1. Commissioner McDowell seconded the motion.

The floor was open for public comment. There was no public comment.

Commissioner Powell stated that she doesn't feel the need to levy the full \$39.00 in an effort to provide some relief to the taxpayers. Chief Kaufmann stated that we are at 32.41 mills, which is 2.59 mills below the voter approved maximum, and he is trying to maintain it for the third year.

Commissioner Davis stated that while he understands Commissioner Powell's concerns, this \$39 is for all properties and everyone is paying. He further stated that after reviewing the budget, hopefully we can keep the millage reduced.
